MyKasih Foundation's expansion to state augurs well for underprivileged

KUCHING: Some 2,000 poor families in Sarawak recipients will visit the retail store and pick out registered under the e-Kasih programme may soon receive due attention via the MyKasih Foundation.

Minister Datuk Fatimah Abdullah said the foundation through its successful 'Love My Neighbourhood (LMN) Love My School (LMS) programme was interested in expanding to the state and its collaboration here would only strengthen the state's battle in poverty eradica-

As such, she believed that it would be best to begin with these group of families, which had yet to receive any form of assistance despite being listed under e-Kasih.

"We welcome MyKasih in wanting to assist us in our poverty eradication programme and the beauty about the foundation is the technology by which they distribute aid to the poor," she told a press conference here after chairing a meeting on the foundation's direction in the state with MyKasih managing director Jeffrey Perera yesterday.

'She said that the foundation made use of a cashless payment system, which allowed it to

distribute aid in a secure, efficient and transparent manner.

So much so, she said eyery sen a donor gave would reach the needy. Those eligible for this aid are families with a combined household income of RM1,500.

Elaborating on the system, Jeffrey said the technology enabled the purchasing of essential way whereby schoolchildren from poor famifood items using the MyKad instead of cash or lies were given a special card too where they volunteer handouts.

This enables us to track the purchasing haballowance, which is put into their MyKad. The amount is RM80.

He said the cashier would scan the items' barcode for approval and the MyKad was used

He said the retailer would then be paid through online banking.

Jeffrey said only specific food items were made available under the programme like rice, sugar, cooking oil, eggs, bread and other basic food to sustain them.

Recently, he said MyKasih ran a pilot project in Long San, Long Keluan and Lusong Laku reaching out to 333 families.

Here, he said additional items like hygiene products such as soap were added as the approved items under the programme.

He said while in the peninsula the allowance rate was RM80, for Sarawak the rate was

"We hope to do more so today marks the first meeting to come up with the road map to take MyKasih to more households here."

He said it was hoped that more corporate bodies and individuals would join the programme as donors.

He said since the start of the foundation some four years ago, it had helped 167,000 families throughout Malaysia.

It was learnt that Jan 20 next year, a meeting would be held with potential donors in Sarawak to rope them in to support the programme.
