# Dear Friends,

he technology that drives MyKasih's cashless welfare distribution has given us the ability to assure our donors that their funds are channelled to targeted rightful beneficiaries and used for their intended purposes. With the generous support from donors and cooperation from retail partners, MyKasih has reached out and channelled RM 240 million worth of aid to more than 260,000 families and students nationwide.

One such donor which we are featuring in this issue is PETRONAS. This year, PETRONAS has allocated RM 7 million for 'Program Sentuhan Kasih' to support 5,400 poor families in eight states with food aid. The support includes an entrepreneurship income-generation training programme for 100 participants in Terengganu.

PETRONAS' collaboration with MyKasih Foundation dates back to July 2010, having rendered food aid to 13,500 families and training programmes for 700 participants. The training programmes resulted in the participants successfully setting up their own businesses and generating additional income.

With this encouraging experience, four income-generation training programmes are being rolled out this year, under the sponsorship of PETRONAS, Bursa Malaysia, Mah Sing Foundation and HSBC Bank Malaysia.

In addition to the 24,000 families MyKasih is reaching out to through the MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme this 2018, 6,500 students in 100 schools are being aided under the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary scheme. Out of the 100 schools, 30 are Orang Asli (indigenous) primary schools in Peninsular Malaysia and 16 are rural flood-affected schools in Sarawak.

We have also adopted six Orang Asli learning centres in Perak, Pahang and Johor, and have installed six computer labs in the Orang Asli schools, in line with the Ministry of Education's 21st Century Classroom Transformation Project. A big 'thank you' to DIALOG Group, The Store Corporation, Linaco Group, Mitsubishi Corporation and individual donors for their support.

It has been a most productive and meaningful year thus far! And we intend to keep the momentum going well into 2019. We hope for your continued support and would like to encourage more corporations to come forward to support the many communities we reach out to.

Again, our sincere thanks from the bottom of our hearts!



### **HOW MYKASIH WORKS**



- Donors or welfare agencies select preferred locations to adopt families under the MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme for a minimum of one year.
- Welfare agencies and/or non-governmental organisations help identify and select needy families based on criteria to assess the eligibility of potential recipients, such as monthly combined household income, number of household members, age, etc. Application Forms for potential beneficiaries are submitted to MyKasih Foundation for Donor's approval.
- Details of approved applications are keyed into the MyKasih Online Portal, where each family is required to nominate a recipient.
- RM 40 is deposited into the recipient's MyKad account twice a month.

Recipients shop for essential goods from ten different product categories such as rice, noodles, bread, biscuits, eggs, seasoning, flour, cooking oil, canned food and beverages.



- Recipients use their MyKad to pay with a limit of RM 80 a month. To guard against abuse, a unique bar-code scanning process at the point-of-sale ensures that only approved selected basic food items are purchased. To activate the payment transaction using the MyKad, recipients are required to key in a personalised 6-digit PIN. Upon a successful transaction, a receipt is generated which informs the recipient of his/her available balance for the next purchase.
- DIV Services Sdn Bhd then administers the payments and sales reconciliation between MyKasih Foundation and the participating retail partner.

Similarly, student beneficiaries under the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary programme use their MyKasih student smartcard to buy food and drinks at the school canteen, as well as books and stationery at the school bookshop. MyKasih believes that if the families' basic needs can be met, the children can complete proper education and hence have the opportunity of stepping out of poverty through better job employment.

MyKasih relies entirely on donations from the public and corporate bodies, which are tax exempted, to help fund the above welfare programmes for the underprivileged. For more information on how to help, visit www.mykasih.com.

Donors select schools which they would like to adopt under the MyKasih 'Love My School' Bursary Programme.

Selected schools will identify underprivileged students using qualitative and quantitative criteria to assess their eligibility. Application Forms for potential beneficiaries are submitted to MyKasih Foundation for Donor's approval.

An account will be opened against selected students' MyKad into which a spending allowance of RM30-40 will be deposited twice a month.

Students shop for books and stationery items at the school bookstore or food items at the school canteen, and pay for their purchases using the MyKasih student smartcard.


All students under the bursary programme are subjected to mid-term reviews of their academic progress in order to stay on the programme.

DIV Services Sdn Bhd administers the payments and reconciliations between MyKasih Foundation and the school bookstore and canteen.




# MyKasih Today


MyKasih started with a pilot MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid project involving 25 families back in December 2008. To-date, we have channeled **RM 240 million** via the MyKasih cashless payment system to more than **260,000 families** in over 400 locations nationwide, out of which, 16,000 are primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.



The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

The Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government, Johor and Sarawak State Governments, as well as Lembaga Zakat Selangor and Majlis Agama Islam Melaka, have been using the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes for the underprivileged.

# Love My Neighbourhood

## **Food Aid Programme**

Food aid is the first step taken to engage with our targeted communities. Based on the needs and readiness of the community, the food aid is often followed by the Love My School bursary programme and other empowerment programmes.

MyKasih Foundation does not give out assistance to the low-income households on an ad-hoc basis. Instead, we make a long-term commitment to empower the people we help.

Food aid recipients receive a bimonthly allowance, which they draw upon using their MyKad or MyKasih smartcard at participating retail outlets. They are able to choose different brands of essential food items from an approved list of ten product categories.

To guard against abuse, a unique barcode-scanning process at the point-of-sale ensures that only approved items are purchased. Recipients key in their 6-digit PIN when paying with their MyKad or MyKasih smartcard.

Transparency and accountability are traits our donors value when deciding to sponsor our projects.

# 10 DIFFERENT PRODUCT CATEGORIES

MyKasih food aid recipients are from low-income households earning a combined monthly household income of RM 1,500 and below. Under the programme, recipients receive a cashless monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential food items at partner retail outlets from 10 different product categories.

n 31 May 2018, The Store Group concluded a public coinbox donation campaign, "Weaving A New Future" which ran from 1 October 2017 to 30 March 2018 in all its 75 outlets nationwide.

The six-month campaign raised RM 108,000 which was donated to MyKasih Foundation to support two Orang Asli community learning centers in Gerik, Perak, and Orang Asli families in Sungai Siput and Gerik through the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme.

In the community learning centers, local villagers run daily literacy classes to ensure the children learn the '3 M's' - Membaca, Mengira, dan Menulis (reading, counting and writing).

Additionally, 79 beneficiaries from the Gerik villages of Kampung Sumpitan, Kampung Kewa and Kampung Cunex will receive a monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential food items at participating retail outlets under the one-year MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme.

# Program Sentuhan Kasih PETRONAS aids 5,400 families

conjunction with Ramadhan, Hari Raya, Hari Gawai and Ka'amatan celebrations, Petroliam Nasional Berhad (PETRONAS) launched Program Sentuhan Kasih PETRONAS in collaboration with MyKasih Foundation.

PETRONAS allocated RM7 million for the monthly Sentuhan Kasih food aid programme for 5,400 low-income families in eight states, namely Terengganu, Melaka, Johor, Kedah, Selangor, Kelantan, Sabah and Sarawak.

During the launch of the programme, East Coast region general manager Wan Mohd Hasnan Abdullah said the contribution was part of PETRONAS' ongoing commitment to help lighten the burden of the poor in the country.

"The allocation is under the Sentuhan PETRONAS programme includes essential food items worth RM80 a month," explained Wan Mohd Hasnan Abdullah.

"The allocation also covers a human resource development programme for 100 women from fishermen families as well as single mothers in the Kuala Nerus district," he added.

PETRONAS first collaborated with MyKasih Foundation in July 2010 on Program Sentuhan Harapan, where RM10 million was spent to support 4,900 families nationwide via its programme.

This was followed by another 3,000 families in Perak and Kedah in 2012; and an additional 5,600 families in 2013.

At the same time, PETRONAS supported supplementary training programmes

for 700 beneficiaries (200 in Peninsula) Malaysia and 500 in Sabah and Sarawak.

The training programmes had yielded encouraging results in terms of providing participants with the opportunity to become financially independent by setting up their own cottage businesses and earning additional income.

The training programme for the 100 participants in Kuala Nerus is expected to be completed by the end of the year.

# Health screening in the jungles of Sungai Siput, Perak





A thumbs up is given by an Orang Asli elder as he gets his teeth checked. The health screening saves villagers a costly journey out to the nearest town, Sungai Siput, Perak, which would take at least 2 hours by car.

nder the morning sky, children and adults of Kampung Kedled in Pos Piah, Perak, line up to get their teeth checked. Dentists from Klinik Pergigian (Dental Clinic) Kuala Kangsar made do with a simple station set up on bare earth and performed minor tooth extractions and cavity fillings. Such is how basic healthcare is provided for Orang Asli living in the interiors.

The dental treatment was part of a health screening activity conducted on Saturday 12 May 2018 for 50 food aid recipients families under the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme supported by Bursa Malaysia.

The health screening took place in collaboration with Klinik Lawatan Pasukan Bergerak Orang Asli (PBOA) Kuala Kangsar, whose medical officers checked the MyKasih recipients for their blood pressure and blood glucose levels, screened them for tuberculosis, and carried out pap smear tests.

In addition to body mass index checks, talks on nutrition and hygiene were delivered to create an awareness about health and wellbeing. Among the take away messages emphasised by the health experts was for the recipients to consume less monosodium glutamate (MSG).

Goodie bags comprising personal hygiene care products such as toothbrush, toothpaste and soap were given out together with a variety of fruits.

Health screening initiatives carried out in collaboration with the Ministry of Health forms part of MyKasih's Love My Neighbourhood programme for food aid recipients and their family members.

# Love My School

## **Student Bursary Programme**

The MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme is an extension of MyKasih's welfare programme for low-income households.

Students from economically-challenged backgrounds are rendered assistance in the form of annual bursaries, which the students draw upon using a smartcard linked to their MyKad account to purchase school books and stationery from the bookstore, as well as meals at the school canteen.

# DIFFERENT PRODUCT CATEGORIES

The bursary programme provides students with allowances via their MyKad-linked student smartcard to pay for their daily meals at the school canteen, as well as books and other learning necessities from the school bookstore.

The aid can be extended to include Back-to-School items such as uniforms, shoes, bags and stationery, to prepare the students for the new academic year.

Students may purchase approved essential items from four product categories.



60 students in SK Sungai Bumbun are supported under the Love My School student bursary programme by Linaco Group and a personal donor, Guiherme Silva. For this year's school sports event, MyKasih Foundation sponsored RM 5,000 for meals and rental of tents and canopies.

Linaco Group will soon be equipping SK Sungai Bumbun with 21st Century IT equipment worth RM 21,530.

# Linaco Group goes deep in the jungle to support Temiar Orang Asli students

yKasih and Rasaku Marketing Sdn Bhd, a company under the Linaco Group, jointly adopted 130 primary school kids of Sekolah Kebangsaan Pos Balar, near Gua Musang, Kelantan, under the MyKasih Love My School student bursary programme.

At the same time, Rasaku extended their support to another 50 students in Sekolah Kebangsaan Sri Melor in Kota Bahru, Kelantan.

Each student beneficiary gets RM60 a month to spend on daily meals and learning necessities which they can purchase in school using their MyKasih smartcard.

Linaco's team braved a 43km off-road journey from Gua Musang to reach SK Pos Balar to spend time with the community and launch the programme on 26 June 2018.

"When we planned to visit SK Pos Balar, our team did not expect it to be so far in the interiors, nor did we expect the drive to be so challenging. It was a shocking realisation for us to learn of communities still living so deep in the forest. But it was one of the most valuable experience for us, as we learnt how the different Orang Asli communities live," shared Stanley Ng, Head of Operation of FKFF (M) Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of Linaco Group.

"We are also humbled to be able to help the students of SK Pos Balar and SK Sri Melor. We wish the kids all the best in their pursuit of education," he further added.

Besides SK Pos Balar and SK Sri Melur, Linaco Group has also adopted SK Sungai Bumbun (A), an Orang Asli school located in Banting, Selangor.

We are truly grateful for the opportunity to adopt two primary schools in Kelantan, one of which is the most rural and hardest to reach Orang Asli school. From this trip we made, we now have an understanding of the many hardships the Temiar Orang Asli face, made more challenging due to their location deep in the jungles. We are blessed to be able to rise to the occasion and render help where it is needed the most.

# **Rotary Kasih Student Life Transformation Programme**

otary International District 3300 and MyKasih Foundation signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on 26 June 2018 to extend an on-going Rotary Kasih Student Life Transformation Programme which was initially launched in November 2014.

The Rotary Kasih Programme capitalises on the fund-raising capabilities of Rotary and MyKasih, which saw the matching of donations to a tune of RM 1.7 million worth of cashless bursaries for 2000 students in 16 schools in Malaysia.

The student beneficiaries receive monthly cashless bursaries of RM60 (for primary students) or RM80 (for secondary students) via their MyKasih smartcard to pay for meals at the school canteen, as well as school uniforms, books, and stationery at the school bookstore.

In commemorating four years of the Rotary Kasih collaboration, both parties (Rotary and MyKasih) renewed their pledge to jointly raise RM500,000 per annum on a matching fund basis to ensure the sustainability of the programme in the Rotary Kasih adopted schools.

The MOU signing and mock cheque presentation ceremony was held at Sekolah Jenis Kebangsaan Tamil Kajang, a school which has been supported under Rotary Kasih since 2015. MyKasih smartcards were distributed to new student beneficiaries that same day.



DIALOG began supporting the Lanjan Tigers in 2016 by sponsoring their sports apparel and participation in district, state and national-level competitions. This year, DIALOG's financial support has enabled SK Bukit Lanjan to host a tournament involving 24 teams, out of which,

two were reigning champions in their respective districts.

Lanjan Tigers proved to be strong and confident competing on home turf and successfully bagged the top prize in the Shield Category.



# Safer Schools Programme

Keeping Orang Asli children safe in schools







6-Day Workshop conducted

Participants of the Safer School programme consists of NGO staff, community leaders and teachers who will return to their respective villages and the communities they work with to deliver a 3-hour talk on "Preventing Child Sexual Abuse".

n line with MyKasih Foundation's increasing focus on Orang Asli and their children's education, MyKasih organised a 6-day "Training of Presenters" workshop on 18-23 June 2018, as part of the 'Safer Schools' programme.

With funding support from Khazanah staff, the Safer Schools project kicked off as a collaborative effort with The Indigenous Peoples Network of Malaysia (JOAS) and was conducted by Protect and Save the Children (P.S.The Children).

The training, titled, "Prevention of Child Sexual Abuse in Orang Asal Schools and Communities", gathered 40 participants from NGO partners, Orang Asli school teachers, as well as community leaders and teachers from community schools supported by MyKasih Foundation from across Peninsular Malaysia, Sabah and Sarawak.

The objective of the training was for the participants to become familiar with basic rights of children and to be able to deliver a 3-hour talk on the prevention of child sexual abuse in their respective communities and schools.

This training was a new experience for the participants which they deeply appreciated. The training concluded with a formation of a support group comprising the participants and the trainers, to encourage and motivate one another as they embark on conducting talks within their community.

# Supplementary Assistance Programmes

With funding from donors and support from trainers and community partners, MyKasih carries out supplementary assistance programmes to provide recipient families with the opportunity to become empowered and financially independent to lead a better life.

- **Skills and Entrepreneurship Training** are conducted by accredited trainers to empower MyKasih participants with the knowledge and skills to realise their full potential and achieve financial independence.
- **Health Screenings** are organised with the Ministry of Health and National Population and Family Development Board (locally known as 'LPPKN').
- **Job Training and Placement** opportunities are given to recipients and their family members to become gainfully employed. In collaboration with retail partners and civil society organisations, employer interviews and hire suitable candidates from the MyKasih database.
- **Tuition and Scholarship**. MyKasih collaborates with tuition providers and various colleges and universities to provide our beneficiaries with tutorial support and award the high-achievers with scholarships.

n June, two gotong-royong clean-up activities were carried out by DIALOG volunteers in the edible garden and school library of Sekolah Kebangsaan Bukit Lanjan (Asli). The activities are part of an on-going employee volunteer programme which DIALOG conducts regularly.

DIALOG adopted SK Bukit Lanjan under the MyKasih 'Love My School' programme in 2014 and is currently supporting 188 students, from the pre-schoolers to the Primary Year 6 students, with cashless bursaries.

The edible garden project was launched on 9 August 2016 in conjunction with the International Day for the World's Indigenous Peoples 2016. With a seed grant of RM 10,000 from DIALOG, the school planted up a garden of vegetables, herbs and fruits which serve as an outdoor classroom for the students, as well as a source of food for the students and the community at large.

The garden is worked on regularly by SK Bukit Lanjan's teachers, students and DIALOG staff, to ensure continued harvest.

SK Bukit Lanjan's Student Affairs Senior Manager, Suhaidi Sapuan, said, "DIALOG has always been supportive of the school's activities and continues to ensure a conducive learning environment for the students. This has greatly motivated not only the students to attend school, but also the teachers to inject more creativity in delivering lessons to keep the students enthused."

"Thank you, DIALOG and MyKasih Foundation, for all that has been done for the school and the students. The regular engagement by DIALOG staff shows that DIALOG really cares for the well-being of our students," added Suhaidi.

# WORLD **ENVIRONMENT DAY 2018**

## **Beat Plastic Pollution Through Recycle For Life**

World celebrate Environment Day (WED) on 5 June 2018, we focus on the efforts we can take to encourage awareness and action to protect our environment.

Each year, WED has a new theme that major corporations, NGOs, communities and governments worldwide adopt to advocate environmental causes. The theme for 2018 is "Beat Plastic Pollution".

In MyKasih Foundation, the Recycle For Life (RFL) programme was given a big push to roll-out nationwide.

Cenviro Sdn. Bhd. (a company owned by Khazanah) conceived RFL together with MyKasih Foundation last year the objective of enhancing the public practice in recycling and supporting the Government's initiative for waste segregation at source. RFL is a programme that provides cash value through a smartcard for recyclable items. The smartcard can then be used by cardholders to pay for essential goods purchased in participating supermarkets, school canteens and bookstores.

In schools, students bring their recyclable wastes to school and have the cash value loaded into their smartcard when the wastes are collected. MyKasih and Cenviro had piloted this programme successfully in Sekolah Jenis Kebangsaan Tamil Ladang Wellesley in Kedah between

August and December last year, and the programme is currently ongoing.

## **SCHOOL EDIBLE GARDEN PROJECTS**

Other than RFL in schools supported under the MyKasih 'Love My School' cashless student bursary scheme, edible garden projects are being encouraged to impart crucial fundamentals of environmental consciousness and social responsibility among the children. School teachers also use the garden to teach Bahasa Malaysia, English, Mathematics and Science.



I am proud to share that RFL is now running in 73 schools with over 2000 students. We hope more schools will come on board to embrace this programme. The innovation by Cenviro to use our smartcard to encourage recycling is a testimony of the versatility of our cashless technology. Cenviro has made this an invigorating collaboration to motivate the general public into becoming more environmentally conscious and responsible.
