Dear Friends,

n this issue of MyKasihNews, we welcome two new donors – the Malaysia Quarries Association (MQA) Selangor / Kuala Lumpur branch and the Federation of Malaysian Manufacturers Malaysian Food Manufacturing Group (FMM MAFMAG). They had raised funds for 250 families to be supported under a one-year Love My Neighbourhood food aid programme in Selangor and Kuala Lumpur.

I would like to thank MQA and FMM MAFMAG for choosing MyKasih as a beneficiary of their charity golf and charity run events. We are deeply touched by the kind gesture from both the industry associations and hope that this will inspire their members to support our cause in the near future.

MyKasih also held two of its own fund-raisers this quarter. An award-winning "Next To Normal" broadway musical was staged at DPAC on 20 July and the ninth annual MyKasih Charity Golf event was held at Glenmarie Golf & Country Club the week after. The events raised RM 130,000 and RM 1.3 million respectively, which went towards the many school and community programmes taking place this year. 9,500 students beneficiaries and 3,300 families are currently being supported with bursaries, food aid, and other supplementary training programmes and activities.

On that note, I would like to extend my heartiest congratulations to the 16 participants of the Permatang Pauh Women's Project, who benefitted from a sewing skills and entrepreneurship training funded by JTI Malaysia.

I would like to also express my deep gratitude to HSBC Bank Malaysia for having MyKasih Foundation at their Kuala Lumpur

head office on 5 August to commemorate their Sustainable Lifestyle Day. I would also like to thank them for approving two more skills and entrepreneurship projects benefitting Orang Asli communities in Selangor and Perak, focusing on sustainable lifestyle and community organic farming. We look forward to another fruitful year of project outcomes.

The pages of this newsletter also report on the investments we are making in schools beyond student bursaries. These cover 'The Sekolah Bola' football programme, KidZania outings, vision screening and free spectacles for MyKasih student beneficiaries.

As we increase our focus towards children's education, we also highlight non-academic needs which could also be met. School rugby and football teams are being adopted by corporate partners to support their long-term growth and development in the field, similar to the Lanjan Tigers and Runchang Panthers Rugby Teams of SK Bukit Lanjan and SK Runchang respectively. We hope to plan similar activities with more corporate partners for other Orang Asli primary schools under our support.




MyKasih Today

MyKasih started with a pilot MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid project involving 25 families back in December 2008. To-date, we have channeled **RM 260 million** via the MyKasih cashless payment system to more than **280,000 families** in over 400 locations nationwide, out of which, 20,000 are primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.



The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

The Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government, Johor and Sarawak State Governments, Lembaga Zakat Selangor, Zakat Pulau Pinang and Majlis Agama Islam Melaka, have also been using the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes for the underprivileged.





Established in **2009**, MyKasih Foundation is a charity organisation founded by DIALOG's Executive Chairman Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat and his wife Puan Sri Jean Ngau, to help low-income families through food aid and education regardless of race, religion or descent.

MyKasih not only aims to improve nutrition through its food aid programme but also strives to transform the families through skills training and education, especially for their children, to break the poverty cycle and give them hope for a better future.

What is significant is that MyKasih uses leading-edge

technology to support its aid distribution. The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme and the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary scheme run on an efficient cashless payment system developed by DIV Services Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of DIALOG.

All disbursements and payments are effected through the use of the MyKad, which is the chip-based ID card issued to all Malaysians. Use of the MyKad allows us to target aid to the right person, enabling us to distribute aid in an efficient, transparent and secure way. This feature is probably the first of its kind in welfare distribution in the world.

OUR FOOD AID PROGRAMME...

The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' is a cashless food aid programme which reaches out to families earning a combined monthly household income of RM 1,500 and below. Recipients receive a monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential items at partner retail outlets.

The approved food items range from ten different product categories such as rice, noodles, bread, biscuits, eggs, seasoning, flour, cooking oil, canned food and beverages. The list of approved items can be expanded to include basic household appliances and schooling necessities for post-disaster relief.



OUR STUDENT BURSARY PROGRAMME...

Under the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme, students from economically-challenged backgrounds are given annual bursaries via a smartcard linked to their MyKad account, to pay for meals at the school canteen and to purchase school books and stationery from the school bookshop.

Additional support is rendered through sponsorship of extra tuition classes, study camps, English literacy and numeracy workshops, and computer labs for 21st century learning. Robotics, aquaponic projects and sports activities are also funded to enhance their learning experience in school.



OUR ORANG ASLI CHILDREN'S EDUCATION FUND...

School drop-outs are most rampant amongst the Orang Asli, and the single, greatest contributing factor to the dropout is poverty. The 'Orang Asli Children's Education Fund' was set up to support indigenous children in national schools and those attending after-school classes at community learning centers.

In catering to the unique needs of the community, the fund ensures that Orang Asli children, especially those in rural areas, are not left behind and are able to attain an education and an opportunity to develop to their fullest potential.



OUR SUPPLEMENTARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMMES...

In our effort to help our beneficiaries break out of the poverty cycle, we work with training partners to provide skills and entrepreneurship training to empower them with knowledge and skills to realise their full potential and achieve financial independence.

Additionally, health awareness programmes and screenings are done in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and the National Population and Family Development Board (locally known as 'LPPKN') to support the holistic well-being of our beneficiaries.



HOW YOU CAN HELP...

We rely on funding from donors to carry out all of the above community and school programmes. Companies are welcome to adopt MyKasih's programmes and brand them accordingly as part of their on-going corporate social responsibility initiatives.




Every ringgit goes a long way in making a difference. All cash donations to MyKasih Foundation are **tax-exempted** and are **passed in full** to the beneficiaries.

9th annual MyKasih Charity Golf event raises RM 1.3 million



MyKasih Foundation held its ninth annual charity golf tournament on 27 July 2019, which successfully raised RM 1.3 million through flight sponsorships and cash donations. Good weather and pristine course conditions greeted 140 golfers who completed 18 holes on the Valley Course of the Glenmarie Golf & Country Club that day.

During the lunch prize presentation ceremony, MyKasih Foundation Chairman and Co-Founder, Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat, gave a heartfelt speech to thank all the golfers and the sponsor organisations for their support. He explained that the proceeds will go towards school and community programmes which are being carried out nationwide.

"We started in 2009 by helping 25 families in Selayang and now, ten years on, the Foundation has reached out to more than 280,000 families and students nationwide and distributed RM 260 million worth of aid directly to them. We could not have achieved this without the concerted effort of partners on the ground, as well as the funding support from generous donors who believe in what we do," said Tan Sri Dr Ngau.

"Much more needs to be done to assist families out of hardship. With continued support from you, we hope that this will result in a better quality of life and a more promising future for the families and students we have committed to help," said Tan Sri Dr Ngau.

The tournament's mode of play was System 36 Stableford over 18 holes. The overall champion for the Men's category was CP Dato' Abdul Rahim Jaafar for Medal A and Zul Atman for Medal B, while the champion for the Ladies' category was Michelle Ting.

Malaysian Food Manufacturing Group feeds 50 urban families



On 3 August 2019, the Federation of Malaysian Manufacturers Malaysian Food Manufacturing Group (FMM MAFMAG) launched the MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' Food Aid Programme with 50 urban poor families from Program Perumahan Rakyat (PPR) Taman Seri Sentosa, Lembah Pantai, Kuala Lumpur.

Under the programme, each family receives a monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad which they can use at participating retail outlets like Giant to purchase essential food items. This programme is in line with the Food & Beverage Manufacturers' aim to provide nourishment and improve the wellbeing of the B40 communities.

FMM MAFMAG volunteers from over 30 companies accompanied the families on their first shopping trip to purchase essential food items at Giant Sri Manja Superstore. Lembah Pantai Member of Parliament, YB Ahmad Fahmi Mohamed Fadzil, and FMM MAFMAG Chairman, Nirmalah Thurai, were present to officiate the event.

"Malnourishment among children particularly in low-cost flats in Kuala Lumpur is a pressing concern that needs to be addressed. A recent study by UNICEF on Urban Child Poverty highlights how child poverty in urban areas is linked to poor dietary habits, leading to the double burden of malnutrition - undernutrition and obesity," said Nirmalah Thurai during her welcoming address.

"As the food and beverages industry, we want to address this issue and provide children and their families with better options for healthier living. Together, our scale and reach allow us to offer a meaningful contribution and accelerate positive change," added Nirmalah Thurai.

In his speech, YB Fahmi Fadzil said, "Many children living in people's housing projects in the city lack proper nourishment as their parents struggle to get them through the day. We commend FMM MAFMAG for lending support to improve the wellbeing of communities in need through programmes like MyKasih's Food Aid Programme. Efforts like these are also aligned with the Government's aim to ease the burden of the poor families and reduce the cost of living by expanding on ongoing food bank programmes."

The Malaysia Quarries Association (MQA) Selangor / Kuala Lumpur Branch presented a cheque amounting to RM 200,000 to MyKasih Foundation during a dinner prize-giving ceremony on 8 August 2019 at the Tropicana Golf & Country Club in Selangor.

The association had raised RM 200,000 through their annual charity golf tournament to support low-income households with one-years' worth of food aid.

"Through our partnership with MyKasih Foundation, we are able to reach out to low-income families in locations where we operate and render assistance," explained MQA Selangor & Kuala Lumpur Branch President Dato' Yap Soon Huat.

200 beneficiary families from Bukit Lagong Sungai Buloh, Kajang, Semenyih, Gombak and Rawang will receive a monthly allowance through their MyKad which they can use at participating retail outlets to purchase essential food items.

A MyKad-based cashless distribution system ensures that charity funds are delivered in a targeted, secure, and transparent manner, directly to rightful recipients and used for their intended purposes.

Beneficiaries will be able to choose from ten different product categories, such as rice, noodles, cooking oil, eggs and others. This exercise restores dignity to the underprivileged by letting them choose the food items they need and paying for it themselves with their MyKad.

"The overall aim of the programme is to help alleviate the burden that underprivileged families have in putting food on the table. We appreciate that 100 percent of our contributions will be channelled in full to the beneficiaries and how efficient and transparent the system is in accounting for how the funds are being utilised. We look forward to kicking off the food aid programme later this year," added Dato' Yap.

Rotary Club of Puchong Centennial (RCPC) has partnered with MyKasih Foundation to bring the Rotary Vision 20/20 Free Vision Screening and Spectacles Project to schools supported by MyKasih.

In August, the club conducted vision checks at DIALOG Tower in Petaling Jaya for 90 Orang Asli primary school students from SK Sungai Judah (Asli), Selangor, and SK Balar (Asli), Kelantan, after completing their KidZania Kuala Lumpur tour. Earlier in April, RCPC completed three vision screenings at SK Bukit Lanjan, SJKC Kerling and SK Kampung Tunku.

Vision impairment can be frustrating for anybody and would affect a child's focus and attention in the classroom. We are grateful to the Rotary Club of Puchong Centennial for partnering with us on this project. We hope will this effort will help our student beneficiaries learn more effectively and do well in their studies. To-date, a total of 810 students have had their vision screened and 160 prescription spectacles were distributed to those who needed them.

Headmaster of SK Balar, Abdul Hadi bin Sulaiman, was surprised to discover that more than half of his students who were screened by the opticians on 27 August needed spectacles.

"I am shocked to learn that so many of my students needed spectacles! I am now very concerned for the other 200 students back in Kelantan who have not had the opportunity to be screened," said Abdul Hadi.

SK Balar is a rural Orang Asli primary school located in the inner recesses of Pos Balar, a 4-hour drive through rough terrain from the town of Gua Musang, Kelantan. The students who hail from the Temiar Orang Asli villages of Pos Balar and Pos Belatim do not have the luxury of learning aids such as spectacles. 130 SK Balar students are currently being supported through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme, jointly funded by LINACO Group and MyKasih Foundation.

Another five MyKasih-supported schools are set to participate in the screening project which will conclude in October 2019.

Sekolah Kebangsaan Bukit Lanjan (Asli) Damansara Perdana in Selangor, a primary school adopted by DIALOG Group under the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme, had their first recyclable waste collection on 31 July 2019.

Under the 'Recycle for Life' (RFL) programme, teachers, parents and students brought recyclable wastes to the school which were collected by an independent waste collector, Teknitek.

Armed with a handheld device, Teknitek loaded the cash value earned into the RFL smartcard of the individual recyclers (cardholders). The total collection that day came up to RM212 from 385kg of recyclable wastes!

'Recycle for Life' (RFL) is a recycling programme that rewards cash through the use of a smartcard, similar to the ones which the student beneficiaries are using under the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme. The main objective of the programme is to enhance the practice of waste segregation at source and recycling.

Conceptualised by Khazanah-owned Cenviro Group and DIV Services, a subsidiary of DIALOG Group, the RFL programme has rolled out to 90 schools with over 6,000 cardholders since 2016. Partnering with MyKasih Foundation, DIV aims to extend the RFL programme in all 100 schools currently under the MyKasih bursary scheme.



DIALOG launches CSR **Programme** in Thailand

It has almost been one year since DIALOG expanded its CSR initiative to Bangkok, Thailand, where DIALOG Systems (Thailand) Ltd operates.

In collaboration with Bangkok's Laksi district office, the MyKasih food aid programme officially kicked-off last year in December 2018 in Laksi with 81 low-income families. The beneficiary families are those earning a combined household income of THB 12,000 per month.

Similar to the MyKasih food aid Programme in Malaysia, each family receives a monthly allowance of THB 500, which is deposited into their MyKasih smartcard account. The card is then used, much like a debit card, to pay for purchases of essential food items at a local provisions store in Laksi district.

Permatang Pauh Women's Project celebrates achievements of women entrepreneurs





The Permatang Pauh Women's project proudly graduated 16 trainees in sewing, sponsored by JTI Malaysia.

36 women received certificates from their trainers on 24 August 2019 during a graduation ceremony graced by YB Nurul Izzah Anwar at Dewan Yayasan Aman in Permatang Pauh, Penang.

Under the Permatang Pauh Women's Project, 20 women were trained in post-natal confinement massage treatment by Tanamera Tropical Spa, while the other 16 were trained in sewing by Mostwell.

The main objective of the skills training and entrepreneurship programme is to empower the ladies to use their newly acquired skills to earn a living.

The sewing skills training programme by Mostwell started in November 2018, funded by JTI Malaysia, and since then, the women have been participating in bazaars and handicraft markets to sell their products while being mentored on their cottage businesses. As of August, at least 6 of the 16 women are now earning more than RM 1,000 - RM 1,500 monthly, while the others are earning RM 50 - RM 150 monthly as a supplementary income.

Moving forward, the 16 seamstresses will be fulfilling job orders from Tanamera Tropical Spa, such as producing 6,000 cloth bags for their spa gift packs.

22 women from MyKasih-supported communities of Sungai Buloh and Bukit Lanjan, Selangor, began their 6-month sewing skills training with SURI Lifestyle in Bukit Lanjan on 14 September 2019.

Working in collaboration with social enterprise SURI Lifestyle on the 'Green Jeans Community Project', MyKasih and SURI will be empowering and training the women with sewing skills to upcycle pre-loved jeans or discarded denim into bags and other lifestyle accessories.

The overall aim is to help these women earn income and achieve financial independence, and at the same time, reduce textile waste from the fashion industry.

Co-Founder and Chief Executive Officer of SURI, Salena Ahmad, said "This project aims to provide the women with skills and job opportunities. We have been blessed with 217 cartons of unsold jeans from Levi Strauss Malaysia and many other materials contributed from numerous donation drives. We intend to upcycle these materials into fashionable lifestyle goods inspired by local designers".

Also present that day were 10 staff from HSBC Bank Malaysia. They met with the programme participants and also got involved in the preparation of fabric to commence the first workshop.



PROGRAM supports basic literacy for rural Orang Asli children







With funding support from Program Pertukaran Fellowship Perdana Menteri Malaysia ('PROGRAM'), five rural community learning centres in Raub, Pahang, and in Gerik and Sungai Siput, Perak, can now conduct their day-to-day educational activities for Orang Asli children.

This support would cover food rations for the students' daily meals, learning and teaching materials, as well as sports and play equipment, for the period of six months (September 2019 - February 2020).

MyKasih Foundation has been supporting Orang Asli community learning centers, or locally known as Pusat Didikan Komuniti (PDK), since 2016. These learning centres are located in rural areas throughout the country and are part of MyKasih communities currently or previously supported under the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme.

Due to the remoteness of these villages, the community initiated these informal schools to ensure that the children have access to basic literacy and at least be able to read, write and count.

Each of the five community schools, namely PDK Sagong and PDK Ulu Semul in Raub, PDK Kiwa and PDK Ong Jelmol in Gerik, and PDK Pos Piah in Sungai Siput, cater to 20-40 children between the age of 5 and 15 years. The students are taught English, Mathematics and Bahasa Malaysia by volunteer teachers from the community.

The funds are channelled in a cashless manner via the MyKad account of the supervising teacher or elected community member to be used for purchases of essential food items at the nearest participating merchant partner of MyKasih.

Sekolah Kebangsaan Bukit Lanjan, an Orang Asli primary school tucked in an enclave in urban Damansara Perdana, Petaling Jaya, hosted the inaugural national-level "All Asli Schools Rugby Championship" on Sunday 29th September 2019 at the Desa Temuan community field.

It was indeed a historic moment for the indigenous communities of Peninsula Malaysia, as the event saw nine schools from Selangor, Pahang, Perak, and Kelantan sending their under-12 Asli rugby teams to participate in the rugby championships.

While rugby is a relatively new sport for the Orang Asli children who are traditionally more familiar with football or sepak takraw, some teams executed their game with confidence and impressive flair that demonstrated their consistent training in sports over the years.

The performance of SK Balar was also commendable as the underdogs, having travelled many hours from the rural interiors of Pos Balar, Gua Musang, Kelantan, to gain knowledge and experience from the exposure. It was indeed a proud moment for the coaches, who were caught exclaiming from the side-lines, "While they may be small in size, they can be very fast!"
