

CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE



Dear Friends,

2021 saw the COVID-19 Movement Control Order (MCO) being extended from MCO2.0 to MCO3.0. As appeals for aid from B40 communities continue to flood in one disaster after another, we reached out to donors with the hope that they were not already pandemic-fatigued from 2020's challenges.

We are extremely thankful to our donor and merchant partners for collaborating with us to support families via our flagship cashless welfare programme. As we serve MyKasih beneficiaries during these difficult times, we truly appreciate the concerted effort of our partners in going the extra mile to ensure that the needs of communities in dire straits are efficiently met. These efforts are documented in subsequent pages of this newsletter.

We achieved a significant milestone in 2021. In June last year, MyKasih Foundation was engaged by Yayasan Hasanah to implement the Government's 'PRIHATIN KASIH' cashless food aid programme. To date, more than RM40 million worth of food aid has been distributed to 138,000 urban poor families nationwide.

Around the same time, the Johor State Government had engaged us to implement the 'KASIH JOHOR' cashless food aid initiative to support 300,000 of Johor's poor with a one-off RM200 allowance per family via the MyKad.

As we navigate through this recovery period that is still plagued with uncertainties, we continue to prioritise the safety and wellbeing of our staff and their families while reaching out to extend assistance to affected groups. In the 12 years since MyKasih's establishment, the last two years have been the most

challenging, yet most rewarding. We remain cautiously persistent in our pursuit to fundraise and execute programmes on behalf of our donor partners.

MyKasih has aligned its programmes with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals in meeting Agenda 2030. We take pride in our strategic partnerships - both at grassroots and at regional levels - in implementing structured community-based programmes supported by donor financing.

We are mindful of using our resources efficiently while capitalising on our partners' strengths to ensure maximum benefit for the most vulnerable of Malaysians. In short, we are happy to offer the use of our cashless welfare distribution system at no cost to any corporation keen to collaborate with us to aid the B40. Through targeted innovative cashless welfare distribution, we hope to also lower the carbon footprint involved in nationwide aid delivery.

Sustainability to us is meaningful interactions and interventions while avoiding the communities' dependency on charity. We carry out long-term food security and livelihood projects where suitable, and provide income-generating opportunities for those involved. With your concern, compassion and support, we can play our roles to help Malaysia build capacity to stay resilient during these unprecedented times as we work towards the national and global goal of zero hunger and no poverty.

We look forward to your continued support. And on that note, my wife and I would like to thank you for your trust in us, and for your concern and care towards those less fortunate.

stablished in 2009, MyKasih Foundation is a charity organisation founded by DIALOG's Executive Chairman Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat and his wife Puan Sri Jean Ngau to help low-income families through food aid and education regardless of race, religion or descent.

MyKasih not only aims to improve nutrition through its food aid programme but also strives to transform families through skills training and education - especially for their children - to break the poverty cycle and give them hope for a better future.

What is significant is that MyKasih uses leading-edge

technology to support its aid distribution. The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme and the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary scheme run on an efficient cashless payment system developed by DIV Services Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of DIALOG.

All disbursements and payments are effected through the use of the MyKad, which is the chip-based ID card issued to all Malaysians. Use of the MyKad allows us to target aid to the right person, enabling us to distribute aid in an efficient, transparent and secure way. This feature is probably the first of its kind in welfare distribution in the world.

OUR FOOD AID PROGRAMME...

The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' is a cashless food aid programme which reaches out to families earning a combined monthly household income of RM1,500 and below. Recipients receive a monthly allowance of RM80 through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential items at partner retail outlets.

The approved food items range from ten different product categories such as rice, noodles, bread, biscuits, eggs, seasoning, flour, cooking oil, canned food, and beverages. The list of approved items can be expanded to include basic household appliances and schooling necessities for post-disaster relief.



OUR STUDENT BURSARY PROGRAMME...

Under the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme, students from economically-challenged backgrounds are given annual bursaries via a smartcard linked to their MyKad account to pay for meals at the school canteen and to purchase school books and stationery from the school bookshop.

Additional support is rendered through sponsorship of extra tuition classes, study camps, English literacy and numeracy workshops, and computer labs for 21st-century learning. Robotics, aquaponic projects and sports activities are also funded to enhance their learning experience in school.



OUR ORANG ASLI CHILDREN'S EDUCATION FUND...

School dropouts are most rampant amongst the Orang Asli and the single, greatest contributing factor to the dropout is poverty. The 'Orang Asli Children's Education Fund' was set up to support indigenous children in national schools and those attending after-school classes at community learning centers.

By catering to the unique needs of the community, the fund ensures that Orang Asli children, especially those in rural areas, are not left behind and are able to attain an education and an opportunity to develop to their fullest potential.



OUR SUPPLEMENTARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMMES...

In our effort to help our beneficiaries break out of the poverty cycle, we work with training partners to provide skills and entrepreneurship workshops to empower them with knowledge and skills to realise their full potential and achieve financial independence.

Additionally, health awareness programmes and screenings are done in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and the National Population and Family Development Board (locally known as 'LPPKN') to support the holistic well-being of our beneficiaries.



HOW YOU CAN HELP...

We rely on funding from donors to carry out all of the above community and school programmes. Companies are welcome to adopt MyKasih's programmes and brand them accordingly as part of their on-going corporate social responsibility initiatives.



Every ringgit goes a long way in making a difference. All cash donations to MyKasih Foundation are tax-exempt and are passed in full to the beneficiaries.


MyKasih will oversee the expenditure and disbursements to ensure that funds are used strictly for their intended purposes. Donors will receive fund utilisation reports detailing the purchasing trends, progress of projects undertaken, as well as impacts and outcomes of investments made.



All donations are passed in full to beneficiaries via their MyKad or MyKasih smartcard.


MyKasih Today

MyKasih started with a pilot MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid project involving 25 families back in 2009. By 2021, we would have channelled **RM380 million** via the MyKasih cashless payment system to more than **750,000 families** in over 400 locations nationwide, out of which, 20,000 are primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.



The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

The Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government, Johor and Sarawak State Governments, Lembaga Zakat Selangor, Zakat Pulau Pinang and Majlis Agama Islam Melaka, have also been using the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes for the underprivileged.

MyKasih And The **UN SDGs**

With the exception of Goal 6 (Clean Water & Sanitation), Goal 7 (Renewable & Clean Energy), Goal 12 (Responsible Consumption & Production) and Goal 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions), various MyKasih programmes are aligned with 13 out of the 17 SDGs as described below:







No Poverty: Our food aid, education and livelihood initiatives provide low-income households with opportunities to step out of poverty. With food on the table and children attending school or vocational studies, family members can participate in skills and entrepreneurial pursuits for a better quality of life.



Hunger: Our targeted cashless food aid and community food security projects ensure that families' basic need for food is met. Beneficiaries are given training in the relevant skills for decent work and gainful employment, which in turn translates to more income for household food expenditure.



Good Health and Well-Being: Good health and well-being are promoted through food aid, school sports programmes, community food security initiatives, as well as health screening. In partnership with local health departments, communities are given general screening which includes dental and vision checks, as well as cervical screening and mammogram.





and school aquaponic edible gardens encourage digital literacy and STEM (Science, Technology, English and Mathematics) education among underprivileged students. Children in rural communities are also not left behind by way of 'jungle schools'.



Equality: Gender promoted equality is empowering young girls through sports and education, as well as providing women with the choice to manage household food budgets and the opportunity to gain new skills to earn a decent



Decent Work and Economic Growth: Our youth development programmes as well as skills and entrepreneurial training income-generation courses help our beneficiaries obtain decent work, thus contributing towards community resilience and nationbuilding.



Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure: Our MyKadbased MyKasih cashless payment system ensures that aid is delivered in an efficient, secure and transparent manner targeted beneficiaries. We continue to innovate to ensure our welfare delivery methods remain relevant and useful.



Reduced Inequalities: programmes do not discriminate based on race, gender or people at-risk. In fact, our initiatives also include marginalised and vulnerable communities such as the indigenous peoples or low-income households who are affected or impacted by HIV &



Sustainable Cities and Communities: Our work building sustainable communities starts first with respecting and empowering the people of the land to determine for themselves the kind of projects and activities which would benefit them. The sense of ownership ensures continuity towards resilience and self-sufficiency.



Climate Action: Our innovative welfare distribution cashless platform leverages on retail partners to serve beneficiaries when they shop under the programme. This circumvents additional carbon footprint involved in traditional aid delivery (i.e. procurement, packing, storage and transportation). Other efforts include community farming, tree-planting, and recycling.



Below Water: For wellbeing of communities most vulnerable to climate change, our efforts include protecting the ecosystems they depend on for food and livelihood. At the same time, conserving critical wetlands such as mangrove forests and seagrass beds which serve as buffers from storms and sponges for floodwaters.



Life On Land: Our food security livelihood initiatives and in rural villages focus on resource efficiency (recycling of biodegradables into compost) and sustainable food production, i.e. integrating short-term cash crops with long-term carbon sequestering rubber and fruit well as livestock trees. as cultivation.



Partnerships For The Goals: We work extensively with partners to achieve the above goals. Our stakeholders range from various government agencies and ministries, donors and retail partners, schools and their educators, NGOs and social enterprises, as well as research institutions.

Government's PRIHATIN KASIH Aid Pandemic Poor PEMERKAS in Pilot Cashless Food Aid **Initiative**

In March 2021, Prime Minister YAB Tan Sri Dato Seri Haii Mahiaddin bin Haii Md Yassin announced the PEMERKASA stimulus package to assist those most affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

PEMERKASA - or the People and Economic Strategic Empowerment Programme – includes various provisions for the urban poor and vulnerable groups under the Bantuan Rentan Bandar (Aid for Urban Vulnerable Group) initiative.

One of the efforts include the 'PRIHATIN KASIH' initiative which provides an allocation of RM100 million in cashless food aid to 300,000 urban poor households nationwide.

In June 2021, MyKasih Foundation was appointed by Yayasan Hasanah implement the Government's PRIHATIN KASIH initiative, running on the unique technology of the MyKad to distribute aid in a targeted, efficient and secure manner.

Starting 1 July 2021, PRIHATIN KASIH beneficiaries received RM100 a month for a period of three months. The amount was credited directly into their MyKad account, which can then be used to purchase essential food items at the nearest participating retail outlet within their neighbourhood.

This initiative was timely and much needed to reduce the cost of living borne by those severely affected by the Movement Control Order (MCO).

KASIH JOHOR Provides Aid for Johor's B40 Community

In November 2021, the Johor State Government launched the PRE Ihsan Johor 3.0 'KASIH JOHOR' cashless food aid programme to lighten the financial burden of 300,000 B40 households. The programme runs on MyKasih's cashless welfare platform via the MyKad.

MyKasih has 97 partner retail outlets throughout Johor (600 nationwide) where the beneficiaries are able shop under KASIH JOHOR. Each selected household received RM200 via their MvKad account to spend on essential food items.

The State selected the beneficiaries based on a combined monthly household income of RM2.500 and below and number of dependents per household.

The Menteri Besar of Johor, YAB Dato' Haji Hasni Mohammad, attended a walkabout at Target Supermarket in Benut on 15 November 2021 to observe the cashless purchases of food items by the beneficiaries and receive first-hand feedback on the programme.

In Johor, MvKasih also works closely with Yayasan Pasir Gudang, Yayasan Pengerang and Yayasan Muafakat

Yayasan Pasir Gudang's Smart Food Programme is a year-long monthly food aid programme for 240 families which has been on-going since 2013. Similarly, Yayasan Muafakat Pontian's Smart Shopping initiative supports 50 families for a year.

To-date, MyKasih Foundation has delivered RM92 million worth of aid to Johor B40 households with support from the state government, as well as corporate donors such as DIALOG, Petronas, Yayasan Hasanah, Linde, Linaco, JTI, BAT and many others.

DIALOG Helps Orang Asli Soar In Education Through empowerNCER MyKasih During The Pandemic

DIALOG carries out it's philanthropic corporate responsibility (CR) efforts through MyKasih Foundation. The bulk of its annual CR contribution goes towards educational support for students from B40 households, specifically those under the empower academic initiatives in the Northern Corridor Economic Region (NCER) and the East Coast Economic Region (ECER).

The MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary programme complements the empower academic initiatives by focusing on the students' overall health and wellbeing. The initiative includes daily meals and schooling necessities, which the students can purchase using their MyKasih smartcard at their school canteen and bookstore.

As such, empowerNCER MyKasih - a public-private collaboration between the Northern Corridor Implementation Authority (NCIA) and MyKasih Foundation - began in 2019 to provide rural Orang Asli students with access to 21st-century education.

In Perak, one of the three states in Peninsular Malaysia with the largest population of Orang Asli, NCIA partners with Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI) to implement empower with a specific focus on basic literacy. The programme involves 900 students from SK Pos Kemar in Hulu Perak, SK Batu 14 and SK Batu 7 in Batang Padang, as well as SK Pos Legap and SK Pos Perwor in Kuala Kangsar.

With full funding support from DIALOG via MyKasih, the programme consists of four main components:-

- Cashless food aid (bursaries) the MyKasih smartcard.
- 21st-century classroom (computer lab equipment, internet connectivity and online learning modules such as i-Learn ACE).
- EV2 LEGO Mindstorm and other robotic toolkits for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education.
- Aquaponic edible garden as an outdoor classroom to develop entrepreneurial skills and exposure to sustainable food production and financial literacy.

The interventions have so far shown positive outcomes in terms improved attendance, better academic performance, and an increased interest towards STEM education.

"In 2020, 400 laptops, projectors and printers were donated to 19 schools, including the above five Orang Asli schools. With the donated laptops, we hope to instil interest in the Asli students to learn and explore more extensively. This is one way to encourage school attendance because of the opportunity to study using digital technology," said Datuk Seri Jebasingam.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the UPSI facilitators mobilised into the Orang Asli villages to conduct literacy and numeracy classes. When the pandemic hit and schools had to close to prevent infections, UPSI trained 31 local Asli facilitators to continue the sessions within their respective villages.

Virtual National Robotics Competition (VNRC) 2021

Virtual National The Robotics Competition (VNRC) was held on 24-30 September 2021 where 74 empowerNCER MyKasih students, including 10 Orang Asli students, participated for the first time. They were exposed to new experiences which hopefully will deepen their interest in robotics or engineering.

At the same time, an empowerNCER MyKasih secondary school, SMK Langkawi, qualified for the Robot Virtual Games (RVG) World Championship in November 2021, where they ranked 34 out of 52 participating groups within their category.

Since students were not able to consume meals at their school during the pandemic, the cashless bursaries were used to prepare monthly food baskets instead.

Mitsubishi Upskills B40 With Online Skills **Programmes**

A total of 53 programmes were offered over the three-month period, including courses on Impactful Presentation Skills for Business, How to Win a Job Interview. Assertive Communication at Work, Learn How To Develop a Positive Mindset, and How To Break The Cycle of Failure. Participants also learned digital skills such as mastering office tools e.g. Sheets, Docs, Slides, Gmail and Google Sites, while the Reading Series for Children was specially designed for primary school-aged students.

The skills courses were developed and conducted by SOLS 24/7 - a leading education provider for the poor - covering categories such as Communication Skills For Children And Youth, Progression, Career Dealing With Conflict, English And Communication For Adults, Readiness, Professional Skills, Digital Skills and Self Discovery.

These sessions were made available to those aged 9 years and above nationwide, although the primary target were youths and young adults who would need these skills in the job market. This initiative was an extension of Mitsubishi's support for Carey Island Community Empowerment Centre.

PROGRAM Helps Asli Primary Students Return To School



Orang Asli primary school students purchasing food at their canteen with the allowance disbursed to them via

Student enrolment for 2021 was significantly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic as some parents were reluctant to allow their children to return to school for fear of getting infected.

In May 2021, PROGRAM contributed RM200,000 to support a total of 278 students in two schools for the full 2021 academic year which has been revised from March 2021 to February 2022 due to the pandemic.

The MyKasih 'Love My School' cashless bursary programme resumed when schools reopened for physical classroom sessions. The Orang Asli students of SK Batu 14 in Tapah, Perak and SK Bukit Gemuruh in Bera, Pahang were able to draw on their individual allotted fund of RM60 per month using their MyKasih student smartcard at the school canteen and bookshop.

Both schools also restarted their aquaponic edible garden project which is used as an outdoor classroom for various subjects such as Science, Mathematics, English and Bahasa Malaysia, Living Skills, and Financial Literacy.

The schools are part of the 32 indigenous schools which MyKasih supports through 'Love My School'. In addition to student bursaries, the schools have also been equipped with computer labs, aquaponics edible gardens, robotics, sports equipment and the relevant software for 21st-century learning.
