2 023 has been a significant year for MyKasih. The Federal Government piloted the Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA) cashless welfare programme using our MyKad payments technology. We delivered food aid and brought impact to more than 112,000 B40 households throughout Peninsula Malaysia over a period of six months. With the successful conclusion of SARA this 2023, we are set to double, if not triple, our efforts to execute SARA in 2024.

Additionally, we kept the momentum going for educational and school sports development initiatives, as well as community livelihood programmes supported by corporate donors. We ran 15 programmes with DIALOG Group, Deleum, Hess Asia, Micron, Yayasan Hartalega, Linde, Oxy Malaysia, Malaysia Airports, and many others. We also partnered with PAN Productions and staged our annual musical fundraiser in aid of the Orang Asli Children's Education Fund.

As we reflect on 2023, some key takeaways are:-

- **Brand** the MyKasih brand is synergistic with the cashless method of welfare distribution via the MyKad.
- Efficient we achieved more with less. Our work on SARA has proven that we can deploy and disburse aid efficiently and account for the ringgits spent by recipients.
- **Teamwork** despite our lean resources, we worked as a team together with our collaborative partners to execute projects.

We will be reinvesting our 2023 achievements and lessons learnt into 2024 and beyond. We continue to offer our MyKad-driven cashless payment system to those interested in targeted access and poverty alleviation through food security and education.

Together, we can do much more. We hope that others will be inspired to join hands with us to improve the lives of families still living in poverty. Our focus is to align and work with highly talented and engaged people, fueled by passion for humanity, to ensure that we grow our charitable footprint in the coming years.

Strategic collaborations and optimisation of humanitarian efforts will allow for resources to be devoted into delivering quality and impactful work. On that note, I would like to express my heartfelt appreciation for the support from our donors, programme partners, beneficiary schools and over 600 retail outlets nationwide.

stablished in 2009, MyKasih Foundation is a charity organisation founded by DIALOG's Executive Chairman Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat and his wife Puan Sri Jean Ngau to help low-income families through food aid and education regardless of race, religion or descent.

MyKasih not only aims to improve nutrition through its food aid programme but also strives to transform families through skills training and education especially for their children - to break the poverty cycle and give them hope for a better future.

What is significant is that MyKasih uses leading-edge technology to support its aid distribution. The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme and the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary scheme run on an efficient cashless payment system

developed by DIV Services Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of DIALOG.

All disbursements and payments are effected through the use of the MyKad, which is the chip-based ID card issued to all Malaysians. Use of the MyKad allows us to target aid to the right person, enabling us to distribute aid in an efficient, transparent and secure way. This feature is probably the first of its kind in welfare distribution in the world.

All donations are passed in full to beneficiaries via their MyKad or MyKasih smartcard.

Our Food Aid Programme

The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' is a cashless food aid programme which reaches out to families earning a combined monthly household income of RM1,500 and below. Recipients receive a monthly allowance through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential items at partner retail outlets.

The approved food items range from ten different product categories such as rice, noodles, bread, biscuits, eggs, seasoning, flour, cooking oil, canned food, and beverages. The list of approved items can be expanded to include basic household appliances and schooling necessities for post-disaster relief.



Our Student Bursary Programme

Under the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme, students from economically-challenged backgrounds are given annual bursaries via a smartcard linked to their MyKad account to pay for meals at the school canteen and to purchase school books and stationery from the school bookshop.





Additional support is rendered through sponsorship of extra tuition classes, study camps, English literacy and numeracy workshops, and computer labs for 21st-century learning. Robotics, aquaponic projects and sports activities are also funded to enhance their learning experience in school.











Sustainability Initiatives

In addition to cashless aid, the foundation provides opportunities for beneficiaries to achieve food security and financial independence. These interventions include basic health screening, food cultivation (fruits and vegetables), farming (fish, chickens and bees), skills and entrepreneurial training, financial literary and incomegeneration projects to help urban households and rural communities improve their quality of life.

Orang Asli Children's Education Fund

MyKasih intensified its efforts in Orang Asli communities through the OA Children's Education Fund which was set up 2015 by Puan Sri Jean Ngau. The fund currently supports nine rural community-initiated learning centres (locally known as Pusat Didikan Komuniti, PDKs) in Perak and Pahang.

The 400 students at these PDKs are taught by local OA teachers from the community itself using specially curated indigenous modules and lesson plans focusing on basic literacy (Reading, Writing, Counting, and Comprehension).

The PDKs are also supported through the establishment of food farms to ensure food and nutrition security as the communities reduce chronic malnutrition and stunting among the young.







How You Can Help...

We rely on funding from donors to carry out all of the above community and school programmes. Companies are welcome to adopt MyKasih's programmes and brand them accordingly as part of their on-going corporate social responsibility initiatives.



Every ringgit goes a long way in making a difference. All cash donations to MyKasih Foundation are taxexempt and are passed in full to the beneficiaries.

MyKasih will oversee the expenditure and disbursements to ensure that funds are used strictly for their intended purposes. Donors will receive fund utilisation reports detailing the purchasing trends, progress of projects undertaken, as well as impacts and outcomes of investments made.


MyKasih Today

MyKasih started with a pilot MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid project involving 25 families back in 2009. By the end of 2023, we have channelled **RM460 million** via the MyKasih cashless payment system to more than **880,000 families** in over 400 locations nationwide, which include primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.



The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

The Federal and State Governments, as well as Zakat agencies, have also been using the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes.

MyKasih And The UN SĎGs

MyKasih programmes are aligned with 13 out of the 17 SDGs as described below:







Poverty: Our food aid, education and livelihood initiatives provide low-income households with opportunities to step out of poverty. With food on the table and children attending school vocational studies, family members can participate in skills and entrepreneurial pursuits for a better quality of life.



Hunger: Our targeted cashless food aid and community food security projects ensure that families' basic need for food is met. Beneficiaries are given training in the relevant skills for decent work and gainful employment, which in turn translates to more income for household food expenditure.



Good Health and Well-Being: Good health and well-being are promoted through food aid, school sports programmes, community food security initiatives, as well as health screening. In partnership with local health departments, communities are given general which dental and vision checks, as well as cervical screening and mammogram.



Quality Education: Investments in Back-To-School necessities, computer labs, robotics equipment and school aquaponic edible gardens encourage digital literacy and STEM (Science, Technology, English and Mathematics) education among underprivileged Children in students. communities are also not left behind by way of 'jungle schools'.



Gender Equality: Gender equality is promoted empowering young girls through sports and education, as well as providing women with the choice to manage household food budgets and the opportunity to gain new skills to earn a decent



Decent Work and Economic Growth: Our youth development programmes as well as skills and entrepreneurial income-generation courses help our beneficiaries obtain decent work, thus contributing towards community resilience and nationbuilding.



Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure: MyKad-Our based MyKasih cashless payment system ensures that aid is delivered in an efficient, secure and transparent manner to targeted beneficiaries. We continue to innovate to ensure our welfare delivery methods remain relevant and useful.



Reduced Inequalities: programmes do not discriminate based on race, gender or people at-risk. In fact, our initiatives also include marginalised and vulnerable communities such as the indigenous peoples or low-income households who are affected or impacted by HIV & AIDS.



Cities Sustainable Communities: Our work in building sustainable communities starts first with respecting and empowering the people of the land to determine for themselves the kind of projects and activities which would benefit them. The sense of ownership ensures continuity towards resilience and self-sufficiency.



Climate Action: Our innovative welfare distribution platform leverages on retail partners to serve beneficiaries when they shop under the programme. This circumvents additional carbon footprint involved in traditional aid delivery (i.e. procurement, packing, storage and transportation). Other efforts include community farming, tree-planting, and recycling.



Below Water: For wellbeing of communities most vulnerable to climate change. our efforts include protecting the ecosystems they depend on for food and livelihood. At the same time, conserving critical wetlands such as mangrove forests and seagrass beds which serve as buffers from storms and sponges for floodwaters.



Life On Land: Our food security livelihood initiatives in rural villages focus on resource efficiency (recycling of biodegradables into compost) and sustainable food production, i.e. integrating short-term cash crops with long-term carbon sequestering rubber and fruit trees, as well as livestock cultivation.



Partnerships For The Goals: We work extensively with partners to achieve the above goals. Our stakeholders range from various government agencies and ministries, donors and retail partners, schools and educators, NGOs and social enterprises, as well as research institutions.



Federal Government Pilots Cashless Rahmah Aid With MyKasih

n June 2023, MyKasih Foundation was appointed by the Federal Government to pilot a six-month cashless food aid programme for the poor. This followed MyKasih's successful completion of the PRIHATIN Kasih cashless food aid project during the COVID-19 pandemic in 2021 which benefitted more than 137,000 recipients.

Federal Government announced in July 2023 that up to a total of 200,000 Sumbangan Tunai Rahmah (STR) recipients who fall under the 'poor' category in the Government's e-kasih database would receive Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA) aid amounting to RM600 starting 17 July 2023. The aid is given through the 'Social Protection for the Needy' initiative, primarily meant to help the less fortunate obtain food supplies to meet basic needs and reduce the cost of living.

SARA recipients in Peninsula Malaysia

received RM100 each month via the MyKasih MyKad platform for a period of six months ending December 2023. For those in Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan, the aid was credited in a lump sum to their Bank Simpanan Nasional (BSN) accounts on 7 August 2023.

Leveraging on a network of over 600 partner retail outlets nationwide, MyKasih deployed the assistance in a staggered approach, with recipients in Terengganu, Kelantan, Kedah, Penang, Selangor, Kuala Lumpur and Negeri Sembilan commencing first on 17 July. Recipients in the states of Johor, Melaka, Perak, Pahang and Perlis commenced two weeks after on 31 July.

The SARA 2023 six-month programme concluded successfully on 15 January 2024. 112,561 recipients did their monthly food aid purchases using their MyKad and spent a cumulative amount of RM66.3 million.

Starting November 2023, the application for STR will be open throughout the year. The government had also decided to expand the Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA) from 200,000 to 700,000 STR recipients in 2024 and to extend the disbursement period of RM100 per month to 12 months, compared to six months previously.

The 2024 SARA programme would also see an expanded list of approved items made available to the recipients, such as selected over-the-counter medicines, schooling items personal hygiene care products.

Yayasan Hartalega **Cares For 600 Students**

s part of Yayasan Hartalega's ongoing commitment to give back to the community, the Social Responsibility (CSR) arm of Hartalega continued its yearly support of 600 underprivileged students from six schools in Bestari Jaya, Selangor.

For seven months from September 2023 to March 2024, each student received a cashless allowance of RM100 per month through their MyKasih smartcard, allowing them to make cashless purchases of food and schooling supplies from their school canteen and bookstore respectively.

A total of RM420,000 was contributed to this cause through the MyKasih 'Love My School' (LMS) cashless student bursary programme to support the students. The six schools involved are Sekolah Kebangsaan Parit Mahang; Sekolah Kebangsaaan Bukit Badong; Sekolah Kebangsaan Bestari Jaya; Sekolah Kebangsaan Ijok; Sekolah

Kebangsaan Jaya Setia; and Sekolah Kebangsaan Rantau Panjang in Bestari Jaya. Students from these schools are predominantly from low-income households whose parents work in nearby factories and plantations.

Hess Asia And Partners Pitch In For Community Wellbeing

ess has been partnering with MyKasih since 2019 to provide families and students underprivileged backgrounds with cashless food aid and student bursaries.

In 2023, Hess continued supporting 41 Orang Asli students of Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Pasir Linggi, Kelantan with monthly cashless bursaries for the full 2023 academic year. This assured the students of their daily meals, as well as stationeries and books needed for classroom lessons.

In September, the oil and gas company, along with its strategic partners ICON Offshore and Tok Bali Supply Base, kicked off their Environmental, Safety, and Health Awareness campaign. After a safety awareness talk with primary students of SK Parang Puting in Kota Bharu, Hess also engaged with approximately 200 community members to remove litter from Pantai Bisikan Bayu, a tranquil stretch of soft sandy beach near the border between Kelantan and Terengganu.

The day concluded with the launch of the 'Love My Neighbourhood' cashless food assistance for 103 Tok Bali households. Each recipient received RM100 to spend at neighbouring retail outlets like Econsave Pasir Putih.

In Kuching, Sarawak, two homes, namely the Sarawak Cheshire Home and the Sarawak Home Salvation Army, each received a one-off RM2.500 food aid support. The contributions were channeled via the caregivers' MyKad which enabled them to shop for essential food supplies for the residents who comprise of children and families in-need to people with disabilities.

In concluding a meaningful year of giving back to the community, Hess renewed their support of the school bursary and food aid programmes for the 2024 amounting to RM200,000.

JTI Malaysia Injects Resilience Into Urban And **Rural Communities**

apan Tobacco International (JTI) continues to invest in communities nationwide through various programmes via MyKasih.

In addition to providing cashless food aid support to 1,000 families in need, JTI contributed RM150,000 towards the Langkawi MAH-SURI sewing skills training programme. The initiative empowered 100 B40 women, single mothers, and men with skills to produce and sell clothing, lifestyle accessories and other high-quality products from upcycled materials (e.g. used denim

and hotel linen).

After six months of training which commenced in May 2023, the MAH-SURI participants graduated in October at Sri Kijang BNM Resort in Langkawi, Kedah. They also benefitted from an informative talk on financial literacy so that they can better manage the income they had begun earning. Following the success of the training programme, SURI Lifestyle will be opening the SURI-Kilim Hub in Ayer Hangat, Langkawi, to serve as a training and production center.



JTI's support also reached the rural Orang Asli communities of Perak and Pahang. In Perak, the Orang Asli of Ong Jangking in Gerik had to relocate and rebuild their homes which had been damaged by a herd of elephants in June 2023. JTI allocated RM20,000, enabling the community to procure a small single-engine boat to transport materials across the river, solar systems to power their homes, and a pump system to access water.

Meanwhile in Raub, Pahang, JTI channelled RM94,200 towards the maintenance of village vehicles critical in the transportation of materials and produce for the chicken and vegetable farms of the Orang Asli communities in Kampung Ruai Ulu and Kampung Ruai Tengah. The village vehicles go through frequent wear and tear due to the bad rural road conditions connecting the communities to the main roads.

With JTI's support, the communities were able to successfully raise and sell two batches of chickens (500 chickens in total) between August and December 2023. Additionally, the Orang Asli completed three harvest cycles of vegetables and fruits (e.g. chillies, bananas, pumpkin, brinjals) from their farm. Each cycle provided them with an average of 25 kg of produce to feed their families.

In continuing their community investment efforts, JTI pledged another RM155,600 for programmes in 2024. Broadly, the support will cover cashless food aid for B40 families and OA communities nationwide, and another round of SURI Langkawi women's skills training programme aimed at providing livelihood opportunities.

Linde's Community Engagement Focuses On Safety & Leadership

inde Malaysia works towards its sustainable development goals through community engagement programmes partnership MyKasih.

The industrial gas supplier has been supporting the Orang Asli students of Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Bukit Tampoi in Dengkil, Selangor, via the 'Love My School' cashless bursary programme since 2022.

In addition to providing the SK Bukit Tampoi Orang Asli students with daily canteen meals and classroom supplies over the years, Linde also sponsored a leadership camp for 45 B40 youths in Bayan Lepas, Penang over the weekend of 9 - 10 December 2023. The participants, aged between 13 and 17 years, were students from the community. They were joined by children of Linde's employees who enriched the group dynamics during the Linde Leadership Youth Camp.

Families of the youth camp participants were also provided a one-off RM100 allowance to shop for essential food items at nearby retail outlets under the 'Love My Neighbourhood' cashless food aid programme.

n December 2023, 15 students graduated from a two-year vocational study at the Guwas Koposizon Centre (GKC) Penampang, Sabah. The initiative was jointly supported by Yayasan Bank Rakyat, which gave the graduates seed funding to start their own businesses.

GKC is a school for experiential and entrepreneurial development which focuses on hard skills in organic farming and food technology, as well as soft skills in entrepreneurship and

personal development (confidence and motivation). The centre welcomes students aged between 15 and 25 years who are keen to make a positive difference in their community.

With funding support from Linaco Group via the MyKasih OA Children's Education Fund, the five Pahang graduates, who are also teachers in their respective community learning centres will be better equipped to impart vital life skills and open new livelihood opportunities for their community members.

Corporate Citizenship Keeps Coasts Clean

staff volunteers from DIALOG Group returned to Pantai Batu Laut in Tanjong Sepat, Selangor for the annual beach clean on October 14. The volunteers collected all sorts of washed-up litter, including cigarette butts, lighters, plastic bottles, food containers, clothes, and tyres.

In just under 2 hours, the team managed to collect and sort through 113.7kg of marine debris. Volunteers conducted a waste audit, sorting the marine debris into various recyclable and non-recyclable categories. Data collected from the waste audit were submitted to a global citizen science cleanup database.

The beach clean event was held in conjunction with International Coastal Clean Up Day 2023, a global event initiated by the Ocean Conservancy to raise awareness on the threats of coastal debris. The event is locally coordinated on an annual basis by Reef Check Malaysia who reported that 29.5 tonnes of marine debris were collected from 400km of coastlines across Malaysia this year.
